

Hymn selections are from <u>The Hymnal 1982</u> or other approved musical resources.


We invite you to fill out a Visitors Information Card and to stay for beverages and refreshments after Worship.


Are you interested in the Sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation, or being received into the Episcopal Church? Please see Fr. Jewson.







A Reading from St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy



I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

The Nicene Creed



Then the Celebrant continues

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember (NN. and) all who minister in your Church. Remember all your people, and those who seek your truth. Remember ______. Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light. And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

Joel 2:23-32

- 1. What are some of the resulting changes in God's people which God brings about by his zealous restoration? What is the end result (verse 27) intended by God's answer to the priests' prayer in verse 17?
- 2. What does this tell you about God's love, power, and uniqueness? About God's care for creation? For God's covenant people?

- 2. What do you find in Paul's sense of hope (in the midst of his suffering) that is an inspiration to you?
- 3. How do you intend to guard the gospel handed to you? How will you pass it on to others?

Luke 18:9-14.

- 1. How does this parable complement the parable from last week (18:1-8)? How do both demonstrate faith? What do both teach about God?
- 2. If Jesus told this story today, who would be the "tax collector" and who would be the "Pharisee"? What would be the Pharisee's prayer today?
- 3. When have you been like the Pharisee in this story? Like the tax collector? What accounts for the difference?
