
The Second Lesson

Reader A reading from the Second Letter of Peter.

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved,- with whom I am well pleased.' ¹⁸We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.¹⁹ So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.²

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. ²And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. ⁴Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' ⁵While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!' ⁶When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. ⁷But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.' ⁸And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. ⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'





For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.




The Breaking of the Bread





The Holy Season of Lent, 2020

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. With the imposition of ashes on our foreheads we are reminded that this life is only a transition from our birth to that larger and everlasting life with God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are fast days, but have you considered fasting throughout the Lenten Season? Fasting can mean: not eating between meals, eating one meal a day, eating two light meals a day, not eating meat, not consuming dairy products, not eating desserts, not drinking alcoholic beverages, etc. Fasting is a time honored spiritual discipline that is recommended for all who do not have a medical reason not to fast. Meatless Fridays are also a suggested practice during Lent.

Fasting can come in other ways—come to church on Ash Wednesday to find out.

You are encouraged to enter the Season of Lent with a purpose and plan in mind for your spiritual growth. Daily Scripture reading, participating in St. Francis' Church Lenten offerings, Bible study, praying the Daily Office, spiritual reading small group activities are all opportunities to deepen your spiritual life and grow positively in the Jesus Christ.


