

Reader: A reading from the Book of the Prophet Amos.


5:6-7, 5:10-15


Finally, let's draw near to the throne of favor with confidence so that we can receive mercy and find grace when we need help.

The Gospel

proclaimed by Archdeacon Harry Leip

Deacon:

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. 10:17-31 Glory to you, Lord Christ.

People:

As Jesus continued down the road, a man ran up, knelt before him, and asked, "Good teacher, what must I do to obtain eternal life?"

Jesus replied, "Why do you call me good? No one is good except the one God. You know the commandments: Don't commit murder. Don't commit adultery. Don't steal. Don't give false testimony. Don't cheat. Honor your father and mother."

"Teacher," he responded, "I've kept all of these things since I was a boy."

Jesus looked at him carefully and loved him. He said, "You are lacking one thing. Go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor. Then you will have treasure in heaven. And come, follow me." But the man was dismayed at this statement and went away saddened, because he had many possessions.

Looking around, Jesus said to his disciples, "It will be very hard for the wealthy to enter God's kingdom!" His words startled the disciples, so Jesus told them again, "Children, it's difficult to enter God's kingdom! It's easier for a camel to squeeze through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter God's kingdom."

They were shocked even more and said to each other, "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus looked at them carefully and said, "It's impossible with human beings, but not with God. All things are possible for God."

Peter said to him, "Look, we've left everything and followed you."

Jesus said, "I assure you that anyone who has left house, brothers, sisters, mother, father, children, or farms because of me and because of the good news will receive one hundred times as much now in this life—houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children, and farms (with harassment)—and in the coming age, eternal life. But many who are first will be last. And many who are last will be first."

Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

Bishop: Vicar: Junior Warde	The Candidates will now be presented. I present Abby, Kathryn, Mary and Tatum for Confirmation. n: I present Ann, Doris, Ellen, Jane, Janet, Joe, John, Mary and Ryan to be received into this Episcopal Communion.
Bishop:	Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?
Candidates:	l do.
Bishop:	Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?
Candidates:	I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.
Bishop:	Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?
People:	We will.
Bishop:	Together let us renew our commitment to Christ.
Deacon: People:	Do you believe in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Deacon: People:	Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
Deacon: People:	Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic universal Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sings, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Bishop:	How will you connect to Christ in community?
People:	With God's help I will continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.
Bishop:	How will you resist and turn to Christ?
People:	With God's help I will persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever I fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord.
Bishop: People:	How will you show Christ in your life? With God's help I will proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ.
Bishop:	How will you seek and serve Christ in your life?
People:	With God's help I will seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving my neighbor as myself.
Bishop: People:	How will you work for the reign of God? With God's help I will strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being.
Bishop:	How will you preserve God's creation?
People:	With God's help I will cherish the wondrous works of God, and protect and restore the beauty and integrity of all creation.

We invite you to extend the peace of God to those in the congregation.



Remembering now his work of redemption and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving, **We celebrate his death and resurrection, as we await the day of his coming.**



The Breaking of the Bread


The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept. Then we sing:

- Bishop: Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.
- People: Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

The Lamb of God

Bishop: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

This Eucharistic table does not belong to the Episcopal Church or to St. Francis'. This is God's table, and all are welcome. In the Episcopal Church, we receive both the bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Jesus. However because of Covid, we cannot all receive from the same cup at the same time, but our cup remains common to us all as a different parishioner receives the cup at each service on behalf of the entire community.




Postcommunion Prayer
