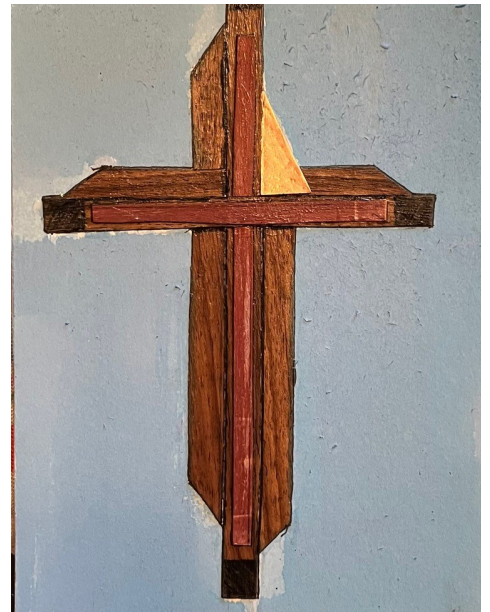
SANCTUARY PAINT

A beautiful representation of the St. Francis Church logo, soon to display photos of the places where St. Francis Church is at work in the world. Artist, Joe Bernert.

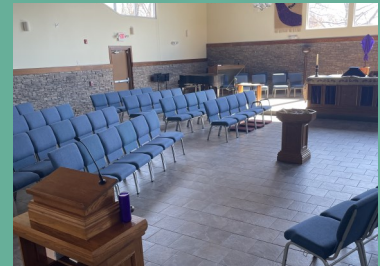


BANNERS/STREAMERS

Living Waters - The baptismal font will be refashioned to contain a water pump to provide a fountain with bubbling water.
