IN TODAY'S LITURGY . . .

WE OBSERVE TRINITY SUNDAY.

The feast that celebrates "the one and equal glory" of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, "in Trinity of Persons and in Unity of Being" (BCP, p. 380). It is celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost. Trinity Sunday is one of the seven principal feasts of the church year (BCP, p. 15).

The Trinity is never mentioned in Scripture. It is the way in which the early church came to understand the relationship between Jesus and God. The Spirit is the outpouring of the loving relationship between the Father and Son.

WE USE A DIFFERENT CREED THAN USUAL.

Our Catechism (pages 851 and 852 in the Book of Common Prayer) teaches that we use two Creeds in worship: The Apostle's Creed, which is the statement of faith recited at baptism, and the Nicene Creed, the Creed we recite at the Eucharist. The creeds are summaries of what it means to be Christian, and they are used widely in the many denominations of Christianity.

A third Creed is found in the Book of Common Prayer (pages 864-865) the Creed of St. Athanasius. Our Catechism teaches, "the Athanasian Creed is an ancient document proclaiming the nature of the Incarnation and of God as Trinity." It is attributed (perhaps incorrectly) to St. Athanasius of Alexandria (297-373), an early church theologian who argued aggressively for the Doctrine of the Trinity at the Council of Nicea. It has a unique trinitarian focus. Bishop Deon authorized us to use this Creed today to honor Trinity Sunday.

THE BULLETIN COVER ART


A Celtic Knot also known as the Celtic Trinity Knot. The Trinity Knot is known for its three oval loops that overlap each other and are interconnected. The three loops have no beginning and no end and can represent the three Persons of the Trinity. The inner circle also serves to bind them, again with no beginning and no end.







Whoever wants to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.

Now this is the catholic faith, that we worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God without confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being.

For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is still another; but there is one God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, all equal in glory and eternal in majesty.

It is necessary that one also believe faithfully that our Lord Jesus Christ became human.
For this is the true faith, that we believe and confess, that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is both God and human:
God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father, and human, born in the world from the being of his mother, perfect God and perfect human, with a rational soul and a human body.

For just as soul and body are one in a human being, so God and human are one in Christ, who suffered for our salvation, descended to the dead, rose from the dead on the third day, ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty and will come to judge the living and the dead. At whose coming, all shall rise with their bodies to give account of their own deeds.

Those who have done what is good will enter eternal life.

This is the catholic faith.




THE LITURGY OF THE TABLE

Presider Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.




