## Happened This Month:

- A large branch from the neighbors' dying tree fell onto our property during a storm this month. Thanks to Herb for sawing up the limb and removing it. We plan to contact our neighbor to find out what their plans are for removing the tree as branches from it are at risk of falling on our dumpster bin or electrical equipment.
- A storm also uprooted the standard ninebark in front of the former childcare center so it had to be removed.
- A "Caution do not bump earthquake sensor" sign has been placed in the front garden to alert workers and prevent future shutdowns of the gas supply to the building.
- Deer deterrent spikes have been placed in the Memorial Garden to protect some of the plants there – the jury is out on whether they work well.
- Installation of the rock border on the front garden is continuing.
- Additional soil has been placed along the sidewalk in areas where it has washed away. It will be seeded soon.

Info for BC: In order to go out into the community to help our neighbors I have been in

contact with Becky Reed at the Pacific Presbyterian Church. Pacific Presbyterian Church has been serving weekly meals to the people in need for years, only stopping during the Covid pandemic. Their church has a full kitchen, a community area that will seat 80 people and funding available for all the meals. The thing their church is lacking is people to help make, serve, and clean up. Their day for serving the weekly meal is Thursday between 4 and 6:30. Volunteers would be needed at different intervals: at 10:30 to help cook and at 3:30 to serve and clean up. Becky and her husband, Jim, make out the menus and usually do the cooking. Any volunteer can make a dessert and bring it to be served with the meal. Becky and I have discussed attempting to set up an interfaith group that could help for an assigned day to participate in the tasks needed. This will be along the same lines that Trinity has established in their hot lunch ministry. I will be contacting Jim Poinsett, with the interfaith group, to set up a meeting with the group along with Becky Reed, Laurie, Mary Ann Kinder, and myself to explore this ministry.

I will be contacting the Eureka Parks Dept. in order to secure a free booth for the Lock It for Love ministry that hands out free gun locks at Eureka Days on October 1 - 3. There will also be a booth for St. Francis to hand out temporary face tattoos which Kathleen O'Reilly will be organizing. The Eureka Days parade will be October 2 under Kathleen's supervision. Kathleen will also be organizing Adopt-a-Family beginning in November and our indoor Halloween party. Busy lady!
